Child sexual abuse (CSA) is a form of child abuse in which an adult or older adolescent abuses a child for sexual stimulation. Sexual abuse refers to the participation of a child in a sexual act aimed toward the physical gratification or the financial profit of the person committing the act.

Types of abuse **PHYSICAL ABUSE** Physical abuse is the non-accidental infliction of physical injury to a child. The abuser is usually a family member or other caretaker and is more likely to be male. One fourth of the confirmed cases of child abuse in the United States involve physical abuse.

Section 19 of the Act requires that an agency establish a child abuse committee to review cases of suspected abuse of a child and to advise the agency. Under section 25, an agency may authorize a medical examination for an apprehended child less than 16 years of age. An agency may also apply to court for an order authorizing a medical examination of an apprehended child 16 years of age or older ...
